

Parking at NHS Forth Valley Hospitals and Health Centres



Important information for Patients and Visitors

Having to attend a hospital or health centre can sometimes be stressful, especially if you have difficulty getting parked when you get there. In every location where NHS Forth Valley delivers health services there are systems in place to manage traffic and provide access. This ranges from simple road markings and car parking bays (white lined) and yellow hatched boxes to pedestrian crossings and access areas for emergency vehicles. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of patients, staff and visitors, it's really important to follow the traffic rules in place.

This means only parking in designated car parks or on roadways that have appropriately identified and lined parking areas. You must only park within official disabled bays if you, or someone you are travelling with, is a blue badge holder. You should never park in bays designated for use by the Scottish Ambulance Service as this could delay seriously ill patients accessing the urgent treatment they require. You should also never park in areas where there are yellow lined pedestrian walkways, double yellow lines or hatched 'box' areas.
